FASCINATING FACTS ABOUT NIGERIA

The longest bridge in Africa

The Third Mainland Bridge (in Lagos State) connecting Lagos Island to the mainland is the longest bridge in Africa - It measures about 11.8km. The bridge starts from aworonsoki which is linked to the Apapa - Oshodi Expressway and Lagos - Ibadan Expressway and ends at the Adeniji Adele interchange on Lagos Island. There is also a link midway through the bridge that leads to the Herbert Macaulay Way, Yaba. The Bridge was built by Julius Berger Nigeria Plc and opened/commissioned by Ex-President Ibrahim Babangida in 1990.
